## The sermon preached by the Rector on Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> July

### Mark 6: 14-29

The future has been so uncertain. Nobody likes to be told what to do, but as a nation we have all had to reckon with a public health emergency. Our health is at a place where it has not been before: mental ill-health; exhaustion from the demands of the pandemic; Long Covid; anxiety about employment, income and future commitments; still, people are contracting Coronavirus; the pandemic has made existing health conditions and new ones doubly hard to bear. The church is struggling as well, for the church is not the building but the people.

Soon, we will be released from the bondage of the restrictions imposed for the pandemic: starting a week tomorrow we expect to be left to make our own decisions. But the Church of England Coronavirus website has always said: 'When the Government announces that a relaxation in the restrictions is coming up, don't assume anything in advance'. Tomorrow week, I will look at the Church of England Coronavirus website for its advice about public worship, weddings, funerals, baptisms, and then I will consult the Standing Committee as to how we respond at St.Mary's Church.

Nobody likes being told what to do. The pandemic has tested us all. We have not always got it right. But as a faith community, we are a forgiving and a forgiven people. We have learned together. We have been changed by the last sixteen months. Her Majesty's Government – the Church of England Coronavirus website – have had to provide a lead in the challenging business of inducing behaviour change. And as we have become subject to the authority of that lead – as our behaviour has been changed in ways that we would not have chosen - now we must learn to exercise responsibly the freewill that – from a week tomorrow – is ours again.

It's a big jump from the behaviours that have been forced on us by the pandemic and the way in which we will now shake them off, to Herod's instinctive rejection of John the Baptist's moral advice, but it's all on the same spectrum of freewill and moral choices. The circumstances of John's death early in the Gospel story confirm our awareness that Jesus is playing for equally high stakes. It's a matter of life and death. Moral choices matter. There are red lines. There will be a judgement

None of us navigates this life cleanly. None of us comes out of the pandemic innocent: we have kept the rules as best we can, and maybe we kept only the rules that we chose to keep. Maybe we got away with it. Because of the nature of a pandemic, we have all been in it together, and, while we celebrate the pulling together and unity of purpose, we may also remember episodes of division and enmity that the pressures of the pandemic have caused.

The Christian response is to confess our sins. In other words, it's a way of life for us that we have the self-awareness that none of us navigates this life cleanly. John the Baptist and our Lord give us the confidence, and in our Lord we trust for absolution. When we have been forgiven, the best thing to do is to let go of regrets and grudges from the past, and instead live each day in the light and life of Christ.
