## We sing a hymn

IN A little book on the writing of his novel, *The Name of the Rose* (1980), Umberto Eco acknowledged that the title did not give any clues as to the content.

Rather than apologising for this, he pointed to what he considered one of the best titles ever devised — *The Three Musketeers*. It was a master-stroke, he said, because it was really about the fourth musketeer (*Reflections on the Name of the Rose*, Secker & Warburg, 1985).

This paradox helps us understand the Doctrine of the Trinity: of God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Paradoxically, many of the readings set for Trinity Sunday point not to God but to people. We do not begin with the Trinitarian God and ask how he can be such, but with the world of particulars, cross, empty tomb, forgiven and believing apostles, asking, ‘How can this be?’

**Icon of the Holy Trinity / the Hospitality of Abraham.  
Andrei Rublov (Андрей Рублёв )1360s – 1427.**

Andrei Rublev painted *The Hospitality of Abraham* in 1411 for the abbot of the Trinity Monastery in Russia. Rublov portrayed what has become the quintessential icon of the Holy Trinity by depicting the three mysterious strangers who visited Abraham (Genesis 18:1-15).

Many in Rublev's culture were confused by the doctrine of the Trinity and others rejected it altogether. Rublov's Trinity showed them an understanding of God as Three-in-One that is beyond trying to "figure out."

Almost 600 years later Rublev's icon continues to draw people into the mysterious and wonderful presence of the Trinity.

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
