The Bible passage that I most often use at a Baptism nowadays is the call by Jesus of his first disciples from Matthew, Chapter 4. I go on to say that that call that Jesus made to the disciples is the call that Jesus makes on each one of us.

So that this may more easily be received at a Baptism, I say that there comes a time for each one of us when we stop and look around, and we ask ourselves, in our awareness of our mortality, what is the basis for our hope. I affirm everyone present by saying that it is our hope in Jesus Christ which brings us to the Baptism. And then I make a challenge. I say that the day will come when the baby being Baptised will have grown, and will hear his extended family talking about his Baptism day. I say that the child will ask: 'What was that all about?' And I go on to say that all of those to whom I am speaking will be able to explain to the child that our hope is in Jesus Christ, who shows us God's love and who saves us at the last, into whose death and Resurrection the child was Baptised.

For those of us who are Baptised and who have heard the call of our Lord, and who faithfully worship every week, the word to describe us is Disciples. We are being formed into disciples of Christ: being open to the Word of God; opening ourselves in prayer before God; waiting on God to know what is God's call on our life. This is our call in discipleship. Rachel Roberts and I are here for you when you ask us to help you to discern God's call on your life.

The Bible reading set to be read at worship on Sunday 12th September is a simple statement made by James in his letter. It's about discipleship. The letter of James, Chapter 3, is direct advice to a local church – as direct to us now as when it was written some 2000 years ago. The tongue is a small part of our body but it can cause great harm by unguarded talk. 'From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers and sisters, this ought not to be so'. It is not profound teaching, but we don't always need profound teaching. This is about cherishing the life of the local church and working with generosity and love for all who comprise that church and for all who seek the Lord Jesus Christ.

I pray that our discipleship together may strengthen and may be a source of joy and celebration and fruitfulness in faith.
