Rector Writes

December 2021

Advent is elemental. Between the earth and the stars; between time past and time present; between the here and the now, all creation waits for the cry of a new-born baby. That is to be dramatic and over-wrought, you might say, but Advent is nothing less than the season of waiting for the annual remembrance of God entering creation. And as God has entered creation once in generous grace, so God will enter creation again in compassionate judgement.

As we enter the darkness of winter, we are naturally thrown back to more primitive responses: the darkness; the cold; the vulnerability to illness; the barrenness of the natural world. In orthodox Christianity, spiritually, these are more than fears that govern us at this time of the year: these are essential reminders of our mortality. The fears of winter are guides and prompts to a greater awareness of our dependence upon God, putting us in our place as creatures of God.

Christmas, when it comes, is all our birthdays because it is the birth day of Jesus Christ. Born as one of us, God is faithful and loving. All our anxieties and fears are taken up by Jesus, even as he is a new born baby. So come to church at St.Mary's in Advent and at Christmas and have a look at the list of services in December. From Christingle on 12th December to the Carol Service on Boxing Day, there is something for everyone!

Covid-safe measures at St.Mary's Church were reviewed by the Parochial Church Council when it met on 23rd Sept.

Covid-safe measures now at St.Mary's Church are:

please wear a mask if you wish;

Holy Communion in one kind;

Maximum of two doors open to promote ventilation.

The PCC agreed that we will no longer have only alternate pews in use and that we will no longer disinfect the pews if they are to be used less than 72 hours after the previous use.

Sometimes when there is a very large congregation for a funeral, worshippers sit in the chancel but, for the time being, this will not be allowed.
