The Thanksgiving Prayer

The Lord is here.

It is indeed right, it is our duty and our joy,
at all times and in all places to give you thanks and praise,
holy Father, heavenly King, almighty and eternal God,
through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord.

And now we give you thanks because you sent him to redeem us
from sin and death and to make us inheritors of everlasting life;
that when he shall come again in power and great triumph to judge
the world, we may with joy behold his appearing, and in confidence
may stand before him.

Accept our praises, heavenly Father, through your Son our Saviour

who, in the same night that he was betrayed, took bread and gave
you thanks; he broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying:
“Take, eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remem-
brance of me”.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup and gave you thanks; he gave it to them, saying: "Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me".

Therefore, heavenly Father, we remember his offering of himself made once for all upon the cross; we proclaim his mighty resurrection and glorious ascension; we look for the coming of your kingdom, and with this bread and this cup we make the memorial of Christ your Son our Lord.

Christ is the bread of life:

**A// When we eat this bread and drink this cup,
we proclaim your death, Lord Jesus,
until you come in glory.**

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of thanks and praise, and as we eat and drink these holy gifts in the presence of your divine majesty, renew us by your Spirit, inspire us with your love and unite us in the body of your Son, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Through him, and with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, with all who stand before you in earth and heaven, we worship you, Father almighty, in songs of everlasting praise:

**A// Blessing and honour and glory and power
be yours for ever and ever. Amen.**
