Philippians 2: 5-11

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, ⁶ who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, ⁷ but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, ⁸he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death - even death on a cross.

⁹ Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, ¹⁰ so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, ¹¹ and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The Rector writes about administration of the sacrament of Holy Communion.

Starting on Easter Day, with at both churches Communicants at the altar rail, at both churches I will administer the wafer which I will dip in the wine each time. I will ensure that my hand touches neither the wine nor your hand as I give you the wafer. I will continue to sanitise my hands several times when I am at the altar and altar rail, and I will continue to wear a mask.

A Service of Thanksgiving for St.Mary's Church and St.Catherine's Church will be held at St.Mary's Church at 9.45am on Sunday 24th April (the Sunday after Easter). There will not be a service at St.Catherine's Church that morning. The service will mark the retirement of the Revd Jon Hale as Rector of the benefice. It will be a Family Service. There will be refreshments afterwards in Nether Alderley Parish Hall.
